Traffic restrictions on Saskatchewan Crescent due to SaskEnergy pipeline installation

SaskEnergy will begin work Tuesday, September 4, 2012, installing permanent natural gas service to residents in Nutana impacted by slope movement earlier this summer.

Starting September 4th, SaskEnergy Gas Construction crews will begin installing new natural gas mains and service connections to affected customers on Saskatchewan Crescent. The new system will connect to customers from the front street, rather than the previously back lane/back easement access. Property owners are responsible for ensuring they hire a licensed plumbing contractor to install piping to connect their home or property to the new SaskEnergy service point.

There will be local road restrictions in the 200-300 blocks of Saskatchewan Crescent during construction.

These customers will continue to be served by temporary natural gas lines during construction, which is anticipated to take 5-7 days. Natural gas service to the surrounding neighbourhood will not be impacted by this work.

Once the new infrastructure is installed, tested and activated, SaskEnergy Gas Construction will move to 11th Street, to install similar front street access to the customers, where geotechnical data has indicated it is safe to provide permanent service. Temporary natural gas service will continue in the interim for the remaining homeowners while they work with their own contractors and provincial Gas Inspections Branch to determine what permanent fuel options are available to them.
