

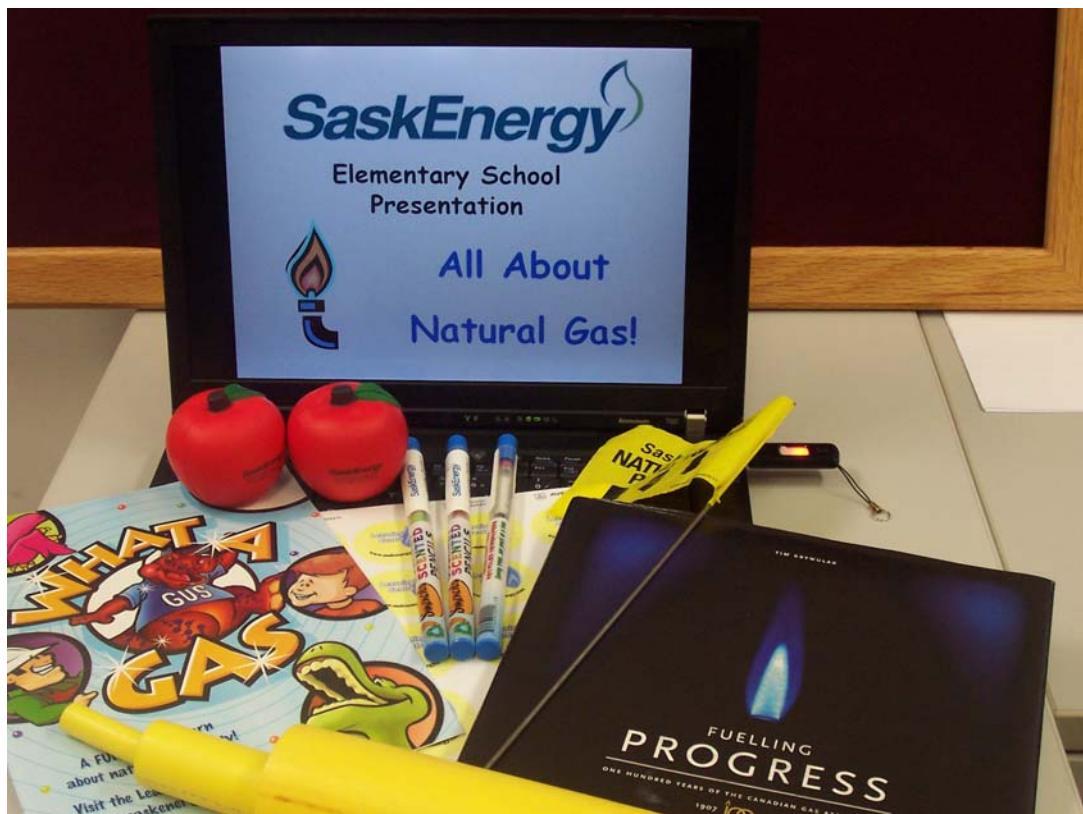
Back 2 School!
